



## Ground breaking

Stonegate Group is adding a three-story addition to the building, while restoring the classical revival façade. The \$19 million project, expected to be complete by spring 2007, will consist of 23 new housing units, three of them affordable, and ground-level retail. McGrath said he's hoping to get restaurants into the retail space at the corner of Washington and Union Park streets. As part of the project, the outbound Silver Line stop currently in front of the building will be moved to the corner of West Dedham and Washington streets, a move that will take place in the next three to five weeks, according to McGrath.
